The 2015-2016 fiscal year was an exceptional one at the business school. Without a doubt, the biggest milestone of the year occurred October 1, 2015, when we announced a transformational gift of \$50M from entrepreneur Stephen Smith. Indeed, that was a tremendous day in the history of the school.

Stephen's gift propelled us over the top of an ambitious fundraising goal set when we began our campaign in 2006. The resulting \$115.5M raised (on a \$65M goal) will help fund the school's priorities to attract the best talent — both faculty and students — and build the school's endowment to be among the largest in Canada. I have frequently discussed the increasingly competitive environment for business schools and the importance of a strong endowment to compete globally. When I look back on the success of the fundraising campaign, I see now that we have created a virtuous circle.

Those students then become alumni and want to give back to their school, both through their donations — which support everything from faculty research to student scholarships and bursaries — and with their time, by mentoring and speaking to students.

- Four-year honours program balances a solid core of business courses with a breadth of arts and sciences electives, international study experiences and leadership development opportunities.

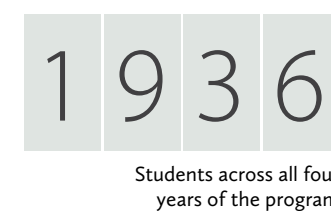

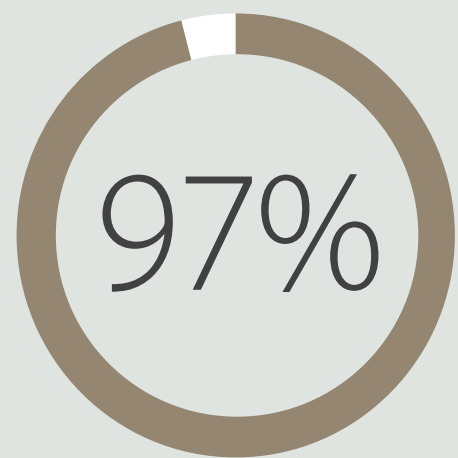


2015/2016 Milestones

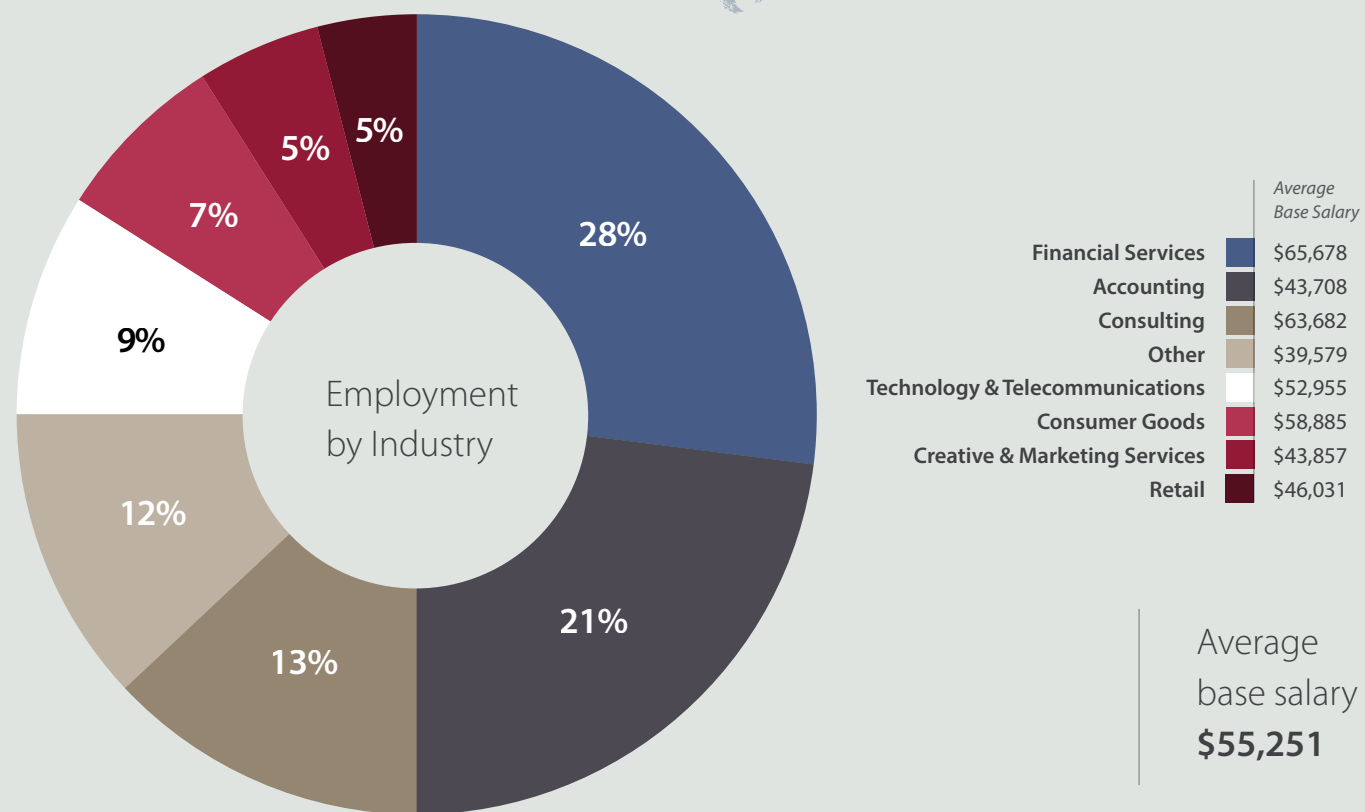
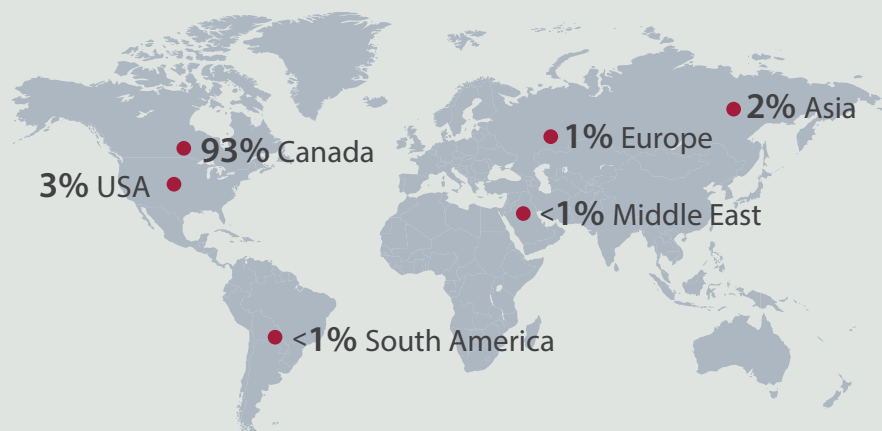
- Received 6,341 applications to the Commerce program for September 2015 entrance, a 5% increase from the previous year.
- The Commerce Society successfully ran 19 conferences and case competitions, including two new conferences: Queen's Conference on the Entertainment Industry and the Queen's Conference on Business and Mining.
- The Queen's Certificate in Business program, launched in 2014, enrolled 160 students. Students earn the certificate after completing six business fundamentals courses.
- 85% of the third-year Commerce class participated in an international exchange and 96% of the second-year class has applied to go on exchange in 2016-2017.
- Commerce teams placed first at case competitions in Dubai, UAE (the KPMG International Case Competition) in April and Vancouver (the CASE IT International Undergraduate Business Case Competition) in February.

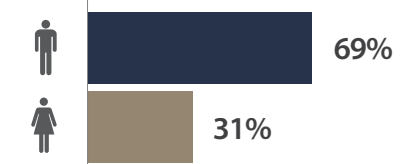

2015/2016 Milestones

- The **Full-time Queen's MBA** Class of 2016 was comprised of 42% international students representing 12 countries. A new Analytics Business Club was launched to enable students to gain insights into the increased emphasis placed on analytics in business. The 2015 charity gala raised more than \$11,700 for Kingston's Almost Home residence for families whose children are hospitalized locally.
- The **EMBA-Americas** Class of 2017 reflected the program's international focus, with 52% based in the U.S., 35% in Canada, 8% in Mexico and 4% in South America (Lima, Peru, and Santiago, Chile).
- The **Queen's Executive MBA** class that started in the summer of 2015 attracted students from across the country in boardroom learning locations and virtual teams in 42 Canadian cities and towns, making it one of the largest EMBA programs in Canada.
- The **Accelerated MBA** program has produced more than 1,000 graduates since its inception in 2004. This year's class is represented by eight teams in the western provinces and seven teams in Ontario and Quebec.

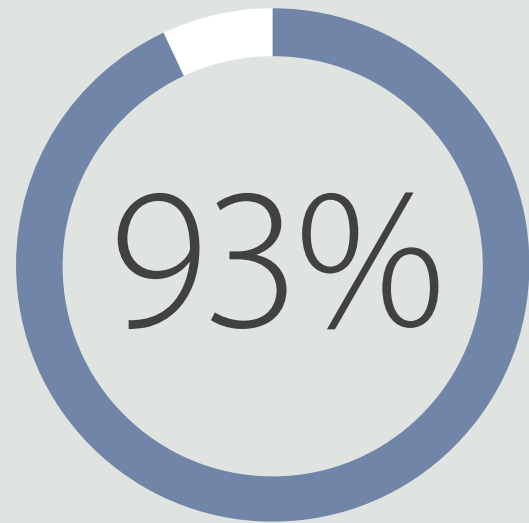

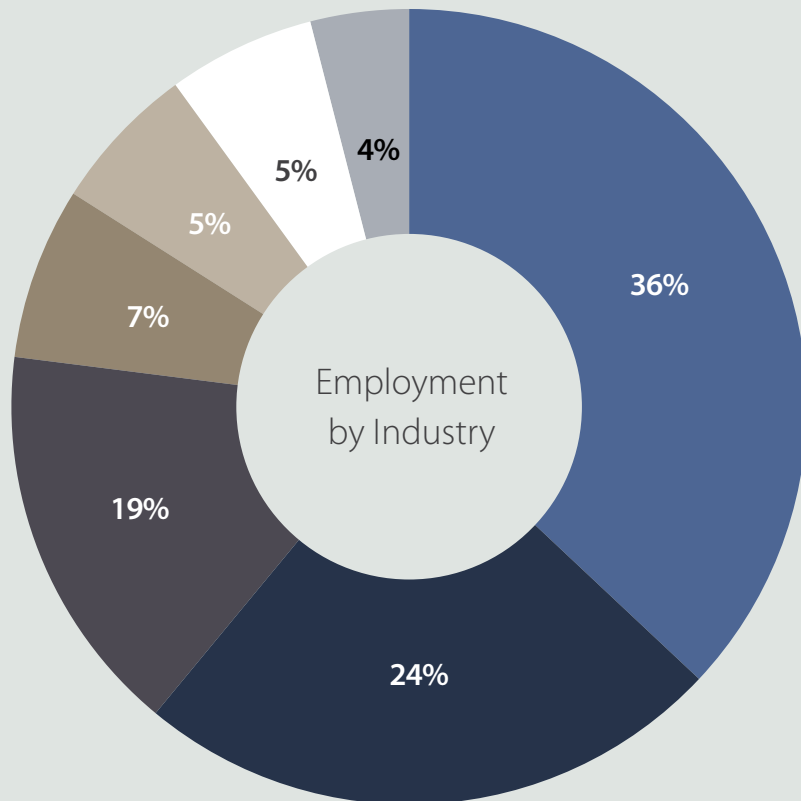
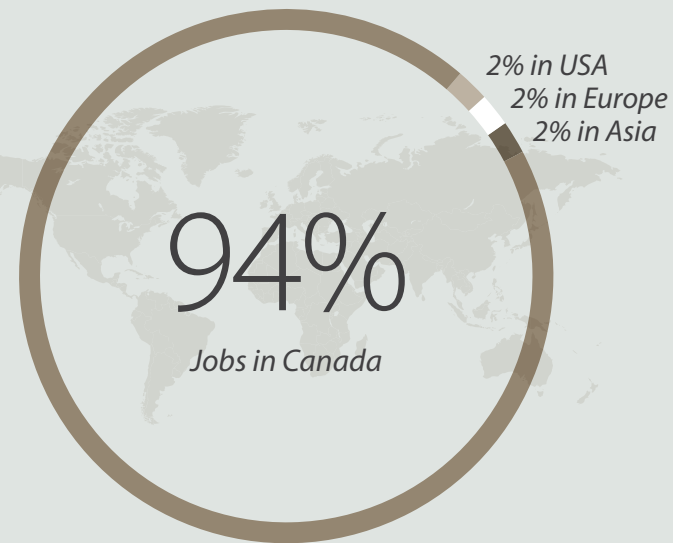

Graduate Programs



Doctoral Program in Management

- Provides students with conceptual and analytic tools required to generate leading-edge research in an individually tailored program that comprises coursework, research and the preparation and defence of a thesis on an original topic.
- Typically requires four to five years of full-time study to complete and equips graduates with the skills and expertise to make a significant contribution to academia.
- In 2015-2016, 44% of eligible PhD students were awarded competitive federal, provincial and university scholarships, providing them with additional funding for their studies.

Master of Science in Management

- Intensive 12-month program focusing on business research in one of nine fields of study: accounting, finance, management information systems, international business, marketing, organizational behaviour, management science, business economics, and strategy.
- Prepares students for entry into high-quality doctoral programs or careers as research analysts or consultants.
- The third annual Graduate Student Consortium offered MSc and PhD students the opportunity to focus on their presentation, writing and teaching skills.

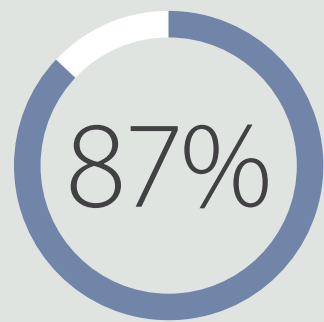

Master of International Business

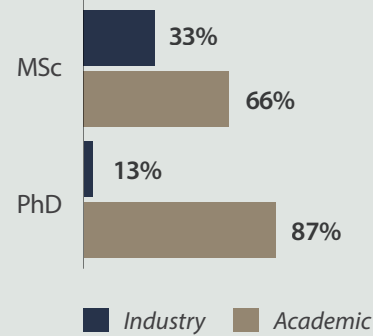
- This 12-month (single degree) to 24-month (double degree) full-time program is designed for people with international business aspirations and an undergraduate degree, preferably in business.
- Combines an in-depth international business curriculum and the opportunity for cross-cultural international experience at one of 47 international business school partners (see complete list at ssb.ca/partners).
- The MIB Class of 2016 featured an internationally diverse group of students from 25 countries.
- Opportunity to earn a second Master's degree by completing more credits through additional study at one of ten partner universities: NHH Norwegian School of Economics (Norway); Bocconi University (Italy); City University of London (U.K.); Copenhagen Business School (Denmark); ESADE Business School (Spain); ESSEC Business School (France); Maastricht University School of Business and Economics (Netherlands); Universidade Católica Portuguesa (Portugal); University of Mannheim (Germany); WU, Vienna University of Economics and Business (Austria);
- The program's 10th anniversary was celebrated at an event in Vienna in April, with eight of ten classes represented.

PhD & MSc CLASSES OF 2015

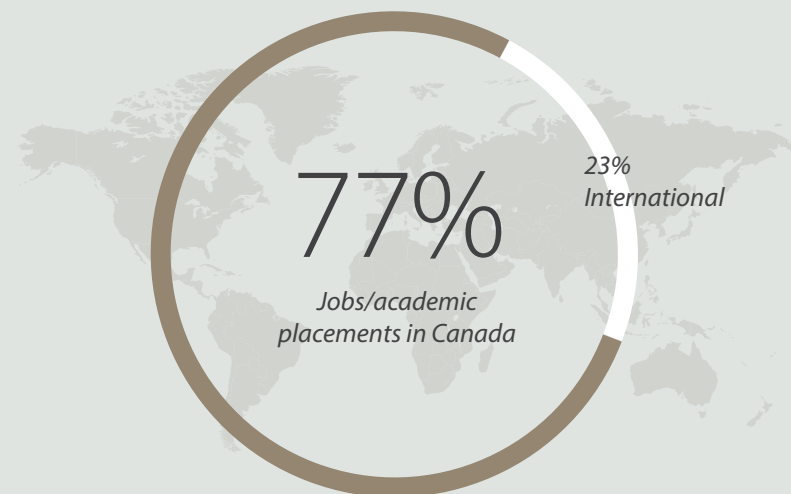


Percentage of MSc and PhD students who acquired jobs or were accepted into post-graduate programs within 6 months of graduation in 2015

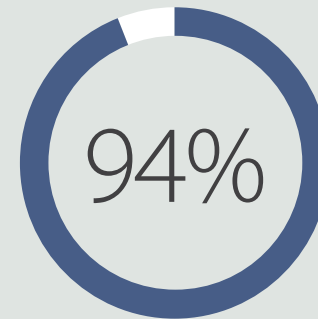

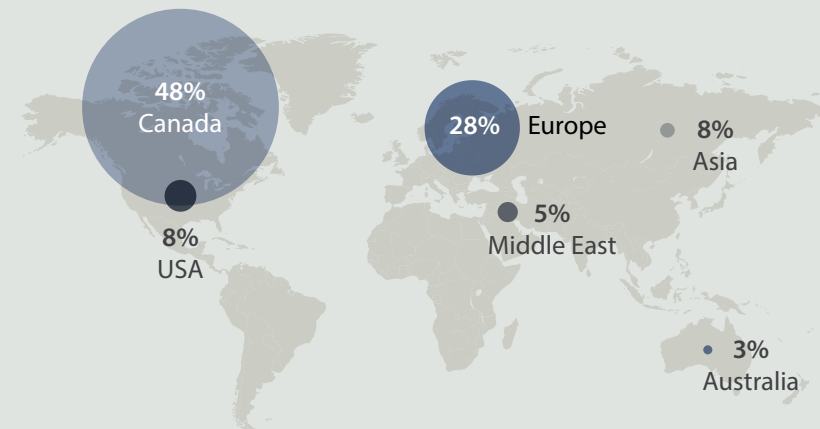
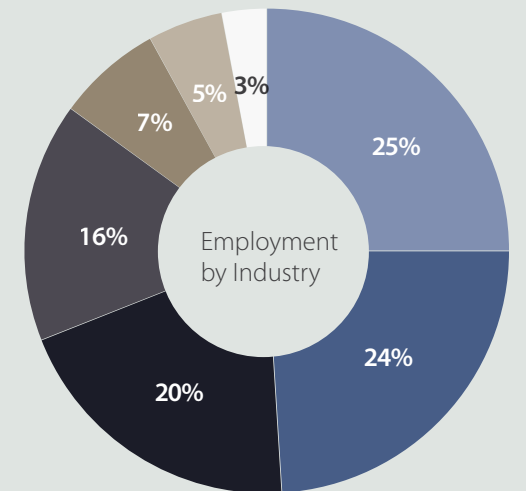

Master of Finance

- Intensive one-year program designed for finance professionals who want to accelerate their careers.
- Curriculum includes optional sessions to prepare students for CFA exams, providing an inside edge for students interested in obtaining the CFA designation.
- After five years of success in Toronto, the program expanded in September 2014 to Beijing, in partnership with Renmin University of China. Graduates of both programs receive a Queen's Master of Finance degree.

Toronto, Canada

Classes held one evening per week and one day on alternate weekends at the school's state-of-the-art facility in downtown Toronto and during residential sessions at Queen's in Kingston. Students may earn an MBA in addition to the MFin degree by applying credits across both programs.

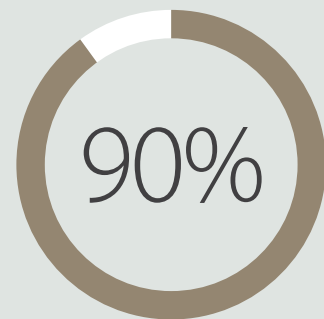
Renmin, China

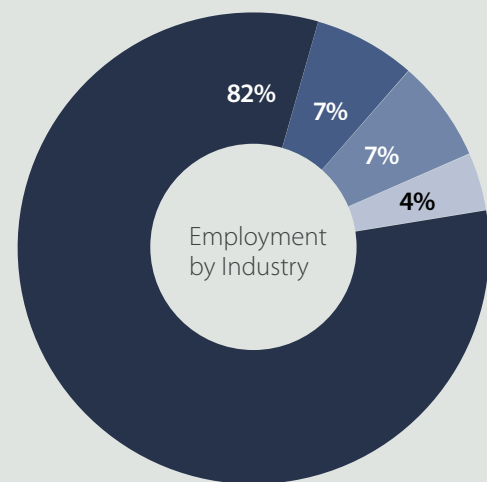

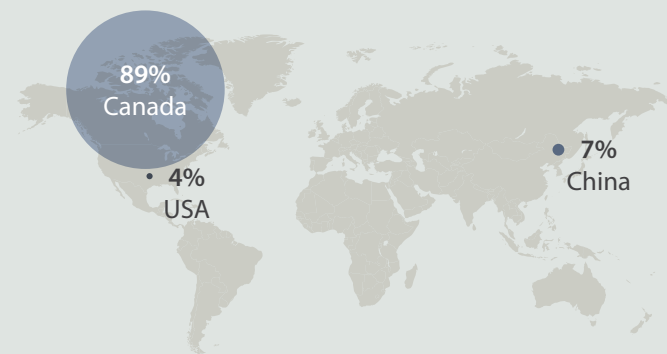

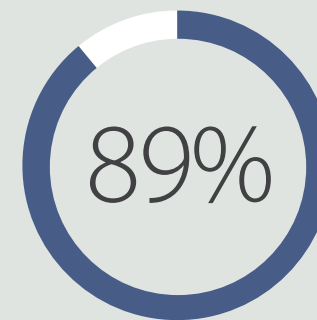

Master of Management Analytics

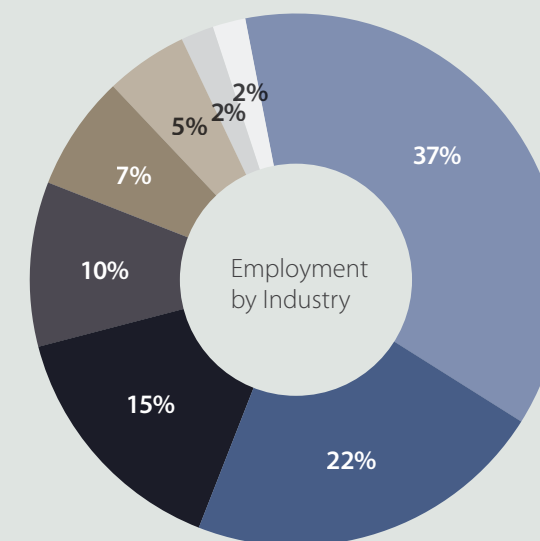
- This intensive 12-month program is offered at the school's state-of-the-art facility in downtown Toronto. The MMA program is designed for students interested in pursuing the growing field of management analytics, in which data collection, analysis and conversion to valuable business output are key needs. According to a McKinsey & Company study, the demand for talent in this specialized field will outpace supply by 50% across North America by 2018.
- Curriculum includes courses that may be applied to obtain a Certified Associate in Project Management designation. The program also prepares students to receive SAS Certification from the leader in business analytics software and services.
- Students may earn an MBA in addition to the MMA degree by applying credits across both programs.

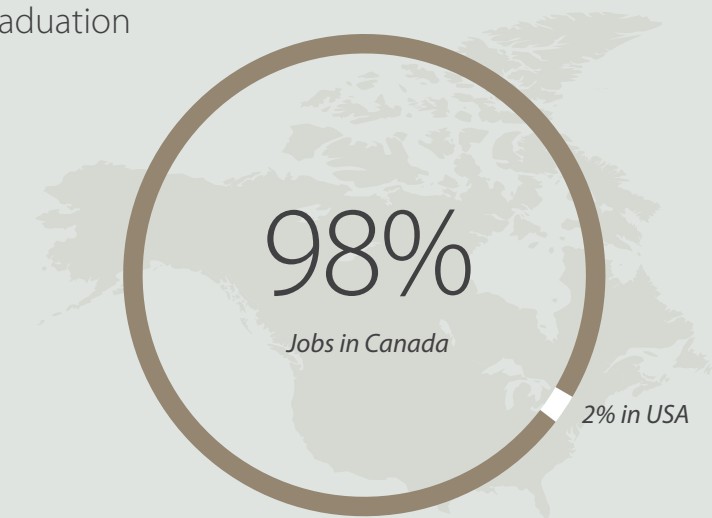
MMA CLASS OF 2015

Master of Entrepreneurship and Innovation

Launched in 2015, this full-time, 12-month program is designed to develop effective leaders in highly entrepreneurial and innovative career pursuits. Offered in partnership with Queen's Faculty of Engineering and Applied Science, classes are led by professors from both faculties.

The curriculum is comprised of eight courses, two of which are major projects. One of these involves researching, developing and launching an innovation idea, including the opportunity to present it to a panel of venture capitalists and angel investors.

The inaugural class of 2016 started businesses in the following sectors: retail, food and beverage, travel, pet care, the digital economy, health and rehabilitation. Others started social enterprises or landed jobs in the entrepreneur-support industry.

Graduate Diploma in Accounting

This 13-week summer program prepares recent business undergraduates to obtain their Chartered Professional Accountant designation. Queen's GDA program comprises five courses that prepare candidates for entry into CPA Capstone Modules 1 and 2. Upon completion of their GDA, candidates are ready to write their professional examinations — a major step in attaining a CPA designation — a full year earlier than had they not completed the program. The GDA Class of 2015 achieved a pass rate of 88% for first-time writers.

Graduate Diploma in Business

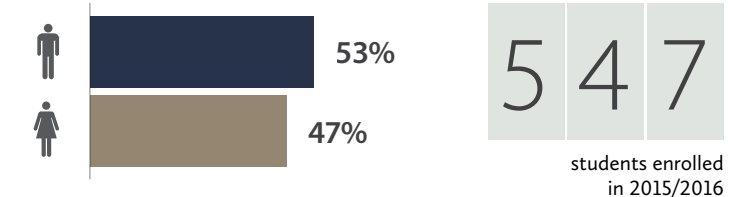

- Eight Smith School of Business professors received research grants from Canada's Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, totalling \$900,000 over five years. The school's success rate was 50%, well above the national rate of 26%.
- The Monieson Collaborative Research Grant initiative was launched to support Smith faculty who share common research interests to work collaboratively to accelerate their research, obtain external grants, and publish in top-tier journals. The aim is to assist faculty in establishing Smith School of Business as a centre of excellence in the topics under investigation.
- Seven new faculty members were recruited and joined the school in the summer of 2016. They will be profiled in *Smith Magazine's* Winter 2017 issue.
- Smith welcomed numerous visiting scholars – see the complete list at ssb.ca/scholars2016.

- Delivered Queen's Executive Education's first-ever multi-modular online program via video stream over WebEx.

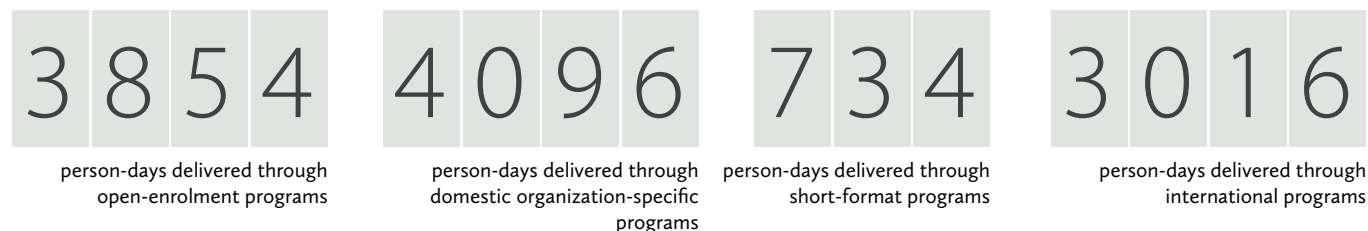

The school's newest research centre was launched in February, named in recognition of a \$2.2 million contribution from Scotiabank. The Centre brings together professors and students to collaborate with Scotiabank teams on applied research in customer analytics. It is also focused on building a community of analytics practitioners and innovators across industries. Smith PhD, MSc, Master of Management Analytics (MMA) and MBA students also benefit from internship opportunities at Scotiabank.

The Centre is committed to improving corporate governance in Canada through a variety of research and teaching programs. It funds academic research into Canadian and international corporate governance issues, and contributes to the creation of leading-edge curriculum. The Centre is partially funded through the generosity of the Chartered Professional Accountants of Ontario.

- A review of the Centre's research impact revealed it had nearly a 100% conversion rate of research grants into research publications for funding received in the previous two years. Half of the publications were in pinnacle journals that contribute to the school's international reputation for high quality research.

Centre for Business Venturing

The Centre for Business Venturing supports the creation, leadership and management of new ventures. Its activities range from embedding new-venture thinking into the curriculum — including an elective course that enables students to invest monies from the TriColour Venture Fund — to providing new ventures with access to capital, and conducting applied research in business venturing.

2015/2016 MILESTONES

- The Queen's Venture Network, launched in March 2015 to connect alumni, students and entrepreneurs, hosted four events in 2015-2016, including panel and guest-speaker presentations and the inaugural UPstart Pitch Competition. The latter featured eight finalist student teams pitching their new ventures to a panel of judges, who awarded a total of \$25,000 to the top two teams. The prize money was donated anonymously by a Smith alumnus.
- Eight student members of the TriColour Venture Fund program evaluated business plans from 16 Ontario companies looking for investors. Students conducted due diligence reviews on four of the plans and recommended investing in one company to the Fund's Advisory Board. The Board did not accept the recommendation to invest and, as a result, there was no investment made in this fiscal year.
- The 2016 Valerie Mann Dare to Dream Internship, valued at \$15,000, was awarded to Ameya Juvekar, MBA'14, for his start-up, healthbuddha.ca, an online marketplace that connects pain sufferers with practitioners who can aid in their recovery.

Queen's Executive Decision Centre

Canada's first electronic group-decision support facility remains much in demand. Participants in meetings facilitated by Centre staff — either at Goodes Hall or using the Portable Decision Centre in their own locations — use the school's innovative facilitation software to contribute their expertise to the discussions. Clients include private- and public-sector organizations as well as Queen's faculty, staff and students.

2015/2016 MILESTONES

- Facilitated more than 100 electronic brainstorming events, including community consultations, multi-stakeholder collaborations and strategy sessions. Clients include think tanks, First Nations communities, and private and public organizations such as the Canadian Country Music Association, the Juno Awards, the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons. Internally, the Centre facilitated workshops involving the Queen's Provost and Vice Principals, administrative committees, research groups, undergraduate classes, graduate seminars and many departmental strategy sessions.

Centre for Social Impact

The Centre's mission is to educate students and foster outreach and advocacy on issues of social impact. This involves promoting education in the fields of responsible leadership and social impact; supporting research and providing advice in key focus areas; providing support for communities; and being a global advocate on issues of responsible leadership and social impact.

- Hosted the annual Social Impact Summit in October, which attracted nearly 200 delegates, including Smith and other Queen's students as well the local community.
- Hosted various speaker series and events, including the Social Innovation Bootcamp for Smith and Queen's students, a Brownbag lunch series, and a Social Innovation Research Showcase, which highlighted Queen's graduate students' social-innovation research projects.
- In its lead role in the campus-wide RECODE initiative, the Centre continues to promote the development of an on- and off-campus social innovation ecosystem.
- Participated in the 2015 Americas Alternative Finance Benchmarking survey as a research partner to assess crowdfunding, peer-to-peer lending and other forms of alternative finance in North, Central and South America.

This year-round venture is managed by senior Commerce students under the guidance of Rob Woyzbun, the Centre's Director. Students provide a range of cost-effective consulting services to small and medium-sized businesses, not-for-profit organizations and other public enterprises.

- Students completed 12 significant consulting projects. These included the development of market expansion strategies for a national cancer research organization and for an Ottawa-based health services start-up. In the not-for-profit category, student teams completed business reviews for the Anglican Church's Archdiocese of Ontario and for the Canadian Arthritis Society, and a major feasibility study for an animal welfare organization. Private-sector projects helped a Kingston high-tech company explore the potential of a new home-automation innovation, and a Kingston fitness club enhance its promotion strategy.

Financial Report

Smith School of Business's funds from various sources increased 9.6% in the 2015-2016 fiscal year. The increase is attributable to the growth of program offerings, such as the Master of Entrepreneurship & Innovation launched in 2015; the expansion of the Master of Management Analytics program due to high demand; and to enrolment increases across other programs.

The extraordinary gift from Queen's alumnus Stephen J.R. Smith will substantially increase the size of the school's endowment, making it one of the largest of any business school in Canada. His gift is already enabling the school to attract the best faculty and students from across Canada and around the world.

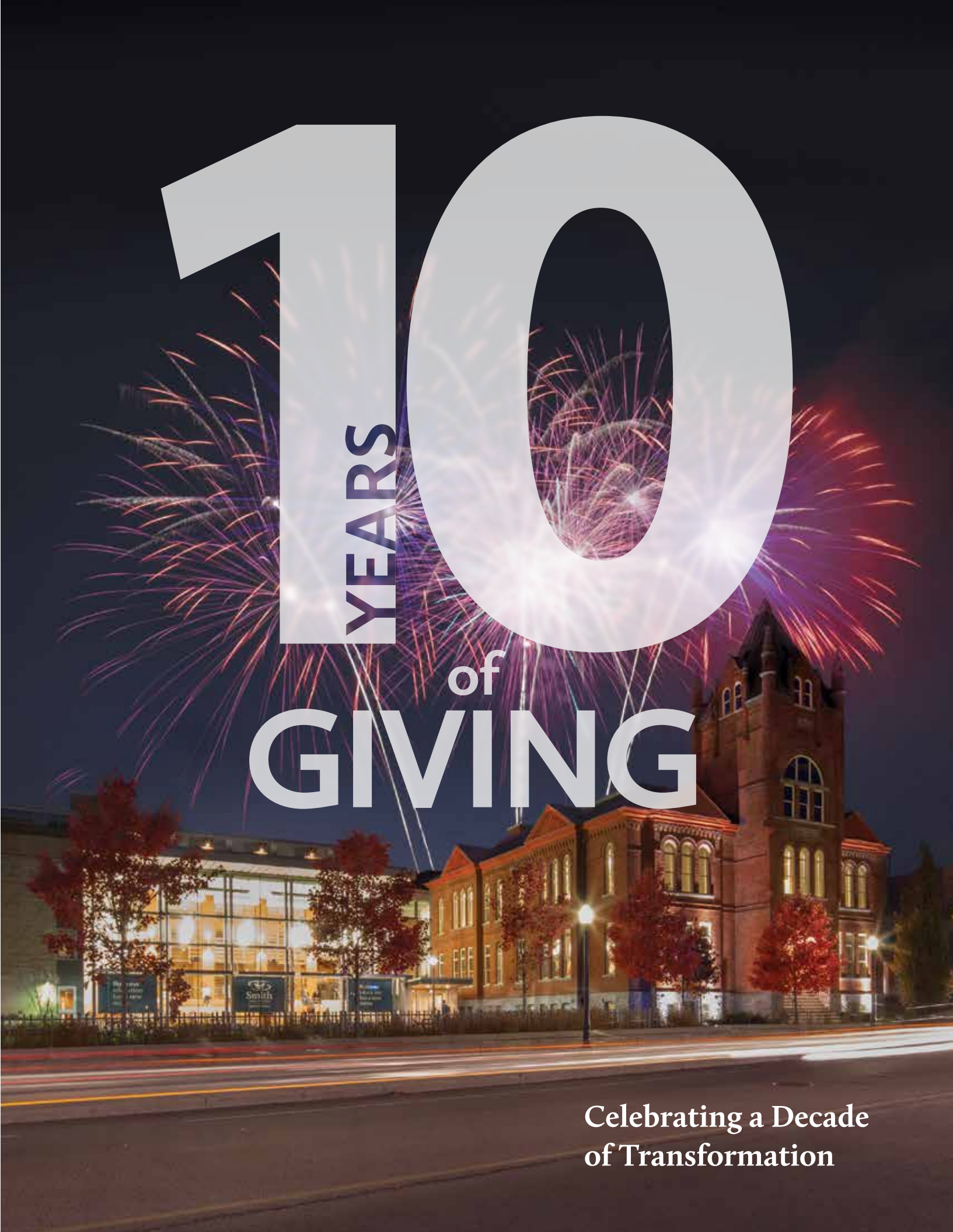

The Smith fundraising effort was part of the larger Queen's Initiative Campaign, which raised \$640,448,000 as of April 30, 2016.

- The student experience has been enriched through
 - the introduction of innovative teaching methods;

 - exposure to programs pioneered by the Centre for Social Impact and Centre for Business Venturing, among the school's other centres.

- The single most significant milestone — a \$50-million gift from Stephen Smith, the largest in Queen's history and the largest to a Canadian business school. At the announcement in October 2015, the school's new name was unveiled: The Stephen J.R. Smith School of Business.

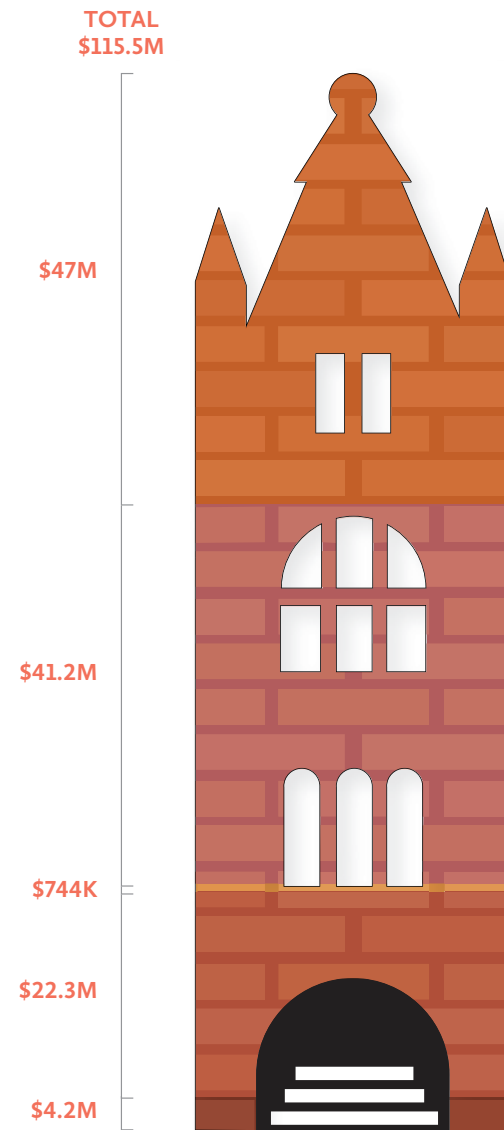

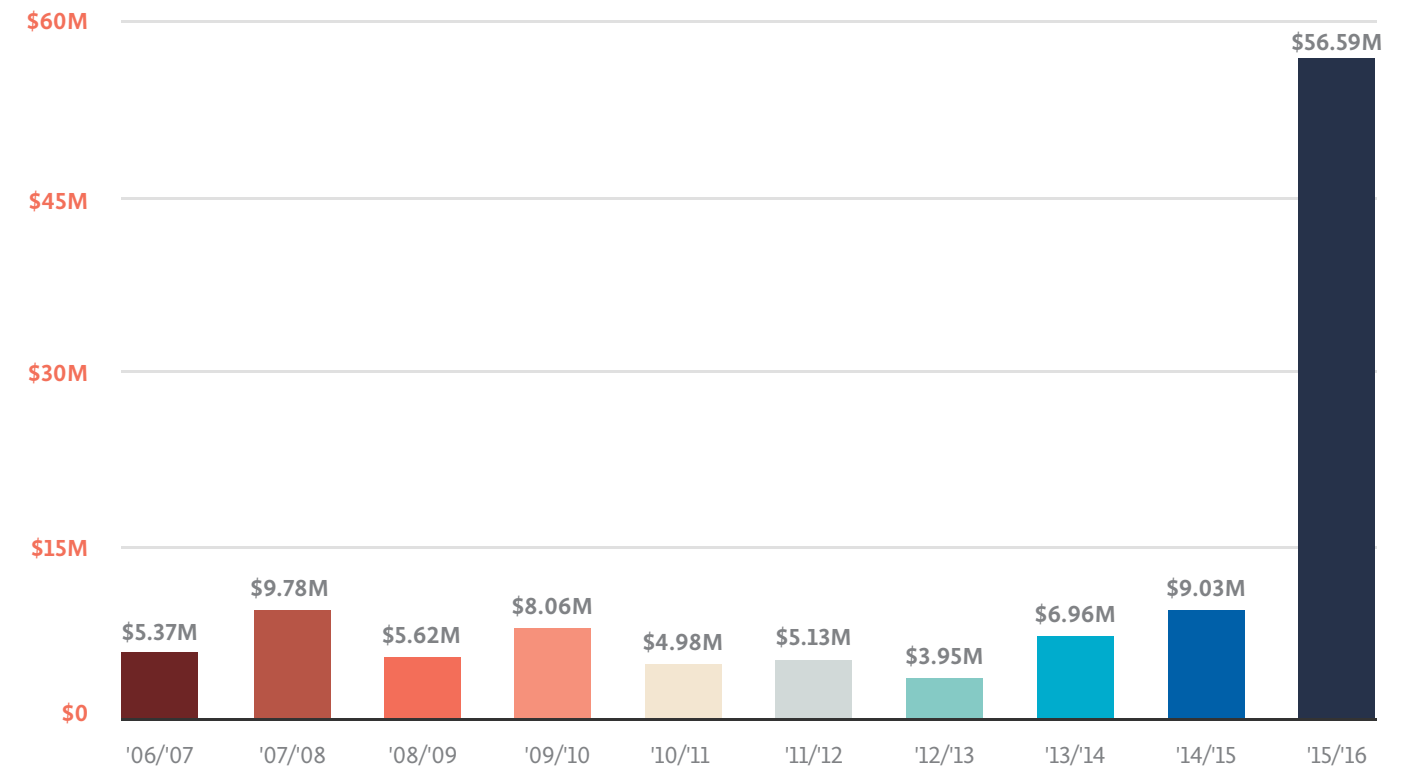

Extraordinary Impact

How the funds raised have enriched Smith School of Business over the life of the campaign:

- **2** new Centres were established: the Scotiabank Centre for Customer Analytics and the CPA Centre for Corporate Governance
- **75,000** square-feet of new space was added when the new wing of Goodes Hall opened in 2012
- **\$500,000** in seed funding went towards the launch of the Living Case initiative
- **\$2M** – Dean's Matching Fund enabled donors to have their gifts matched, doubled or even tripled
- **\$7.3M** for new learning opportunities delivered by the Centre for Social Impact, Centre for Business Venturing and for student investment clubs QUIC and QUAAF
- **\$17M** for scholarships, bursaries and awards for Commerce students
- **\$20.3M** for scholarships and fellowships for MBA and other graduate students
- **\$39.2M** for new Chairs, Professorships and Fellowships that attract and retain exceptional faculty

Overall, the Invest in Smith Campaign has resulted in a \$75.8M increase in the amount of the Smith School of Business endowment fund.

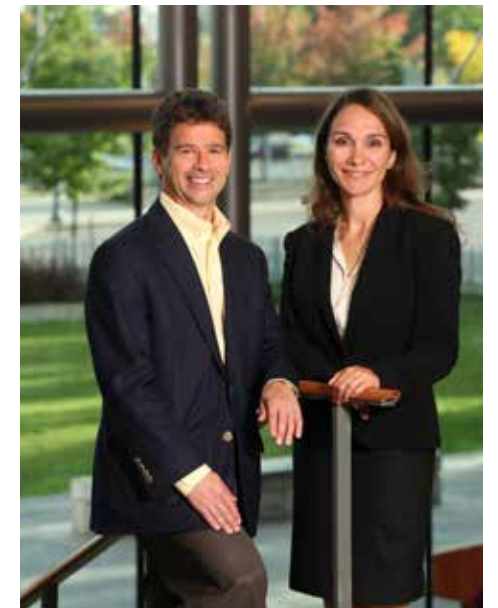

“The Comm’08 class got behind the construction of the new wing of Goodes Hall at the architectural-drawing stage. 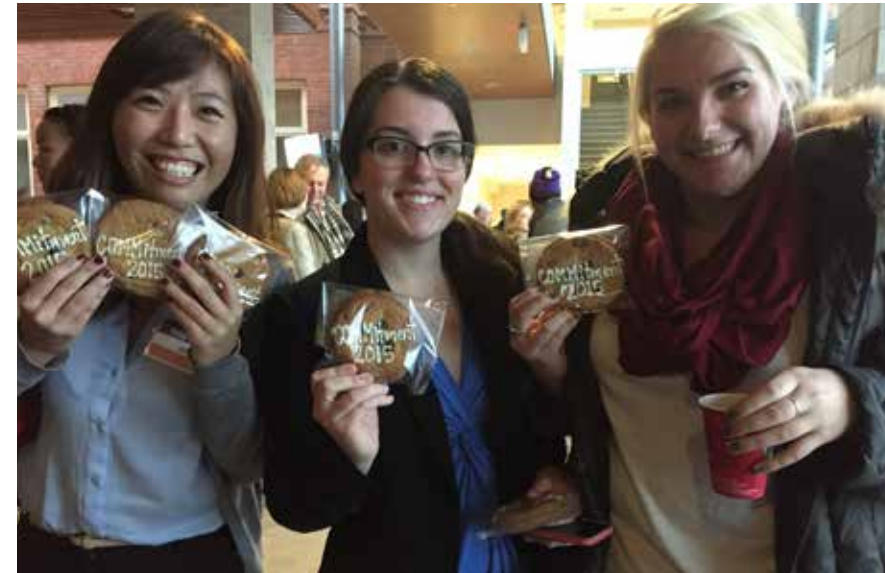
